## Cocktails

**Licoreria Limantour:** Impressive mixology without pretensions, a relaxed place with the best cocktails.

**Mansione Artemisa:** Classic cocktail bar inspired by the Franco-Mexican culture, in a beautiful porfirian house with eclectic music.

**Bar las Brujas:** All female staff as a coven, dedication to mexican herbalism as a head line.

**Café de Nadie:** Cool vibe bar for a casual evening musicalized with its huge vinyl collection.

**Rayo:** A contemporary proposal that explores the folklore and mysticism of the agave plant.

## Speakeasy

**Hand Shake:** Many times awarded bar for its ambiance and cocktail bar, a magnificent experience.

**Bosforo:** The best and most vast selection of artisanal mezcals; the most interesting and eclectic selection of music; try the food from it's partner restaurant.

**Musak:** Hifi bar, if you love music this is your place, bar focused on giving you a sonic experience.





# Museums

CDMX has one of the largest cultural offerings in the world so we recommend these museum circuits by zone.

## In Chapultepec



**Museo de Antropología:** Huge museum that explores the richness of our indigenous past, it has a restaurant inside with an interesting proposal.

**Museo Tamayo:** Collection that sought to show the beauty of indigenous Mexico in a modern context, contrasted with international artists.

**Museo de arte moderno:** Beautiful temporary exhibitions and a beautiful sculpture garden in the background where you can enjoy a coffee.



**Parque de Chapultepec:** Stroll through its gigantic gardens in the middle of the city with a colorful changuito (fake fur monkey) on your head. The best view is from the castle or you can visit its botanical garden too.

## In Centro Histórico



**Templo Mayor:** Get to know the city beneath the city. Explore the beginning of CDMX as an urban center and our national identity.

**Catedral Metropolitana de la CDMX:** Appreciate the beauty of colonial art in its huge altars. It's free, be quiet and respectful, no sunglasses, hats and no flash photography.

**Museo de arte popular:** One of the most colorful, dedicated to preserving and promoting Mexican folk art.

**Palacio de Bellas Artes:** A beautiful post-revolutionary building, museum of architecture and with amazing murals inside, you can also enjoy symphonic concerts or folkloric ballets.





## In Polanco

These two museums are a great combination to visit on the same day:

**Museo Soumaya:** Impressive modern architecture that houses a large eclectic collection.

**Museo Jumex:** Always with a fresh and interesting proposal of modern art, its terrace is the best place to enjoy something from its cafeteria and watch the sunset over the Soumaya.



## Coyoacán

**MUAC:** Beautiful building that houses the contemporary art collection of the UNAM, representative of the development of contemporary art in Mexico.

**Diego Rivera Anahucalli:** It stands out for its extensive collection of pre-Hispanic art, with a unique architecture.

**Casa azul Frida Khalo:** House where the prominent artist was born and raised, focusing on her life and past rather than her work.



## Mercados

**Mercado de la Ciudadela:** Real handicrafts, quaint even without buying anything, the best source of truly Mexican souvenirs.

**Mercado San Jaun Pugibet:** Fruits, insects and exotic cuts, beautiful colors and a gastronomic adventure.

**Mercado de Jamaica:** Fragrant market famous for its flowers, visually striking.

**Mercado Roma:** Hipster interpretation of Mexico's traditional markets, great food and beverage offerings.
